

OFFICIAL BADGES

1 Orienteering Australia shall have a number of official badges known, respectively, as:

- the OA Badge
- the Badge Scheme Badge
- the AUS-NZL Challenge Team Badge
- the Australian Elite Team Badges.

2 **OA Badge.** The design of the OA Badge is shown in Fig 1 (in 3 different formats – full colour, black and red, black tone). This badge shall be used where a logo is required:

- on OA letterhead and envelopes
- on OA reports and publications (including "The Australian Orienteer") on any OA flags or banners
- in any other situations apart from uniforms for Australian teams.

3 **OA Badge Scheme.** For cloth badges issued under the OA Badge Scheme the design shall be as in Fig 2 (in red and white with the kangaroo in gold, silver or bronze). The year and age class shall be marked or embroidered on the badge. No other modification to the design of the badge shall be made without approval of the approval of the OA Board.

4 **AUS-NZL Challenge Team Badge.** The design of the AUS-NZL Challenge Team Badge is shown in Fig 3 (in green and gold). This badge may be used on the tracksuits and running suits of members of Australian representative

- Orienteering teams other than teams participating in Elite competitions (such as the World Orienteering Championships, World Junior Orienteering Championships, World Games or World Cups).
- The year when the relevant competition is conducted shall be specified on the AUS-NZL Challenge Team Badge. No other modification to the badge may be made without approval of the OA Board.

5 **Australian Elite Team Badges.** There shall be no standard design for the Australian Team Badge for teams participating in Elite competitions. The Australian Team Badge for each team may have its own identity, reflecting that particular Championship or it may be incorporated into the design of the tracksuit and running suit. Teams competing in the foot World Orienteering Championships may wear the Australian Boomerangs badge; see Fig 4. If a special badge is prepared it shall be used on the tracksuits and running suits of members of the team participating in the relevant event.

6 Any person receiving a badge by virtue of his/her selection in an Australian representative orienteering team shall be permitted to wear the badge indefinitely.

7 Orienteering Australia may make the wearing of a team badge in a specified manner a condition of selection in a team and may require team members to pay an amount for purchase of the badge which does not exceed the cost of manufacture.
