

9. More Man-Made Features

Although earthworks, some water features, vegetation and even rock features can be man-made, a certain subset of features are typically described as “man-made”.

We have seen man-made linear features such as roads, paths and fences. Further distinct linear features include stone walls and above-ground pipelines. Gates, tunnels and bridges associated with these features are mapped.

Buildings, ruined buildings, towers, cairns and graves also have dedicated map symbols.

Two further non-specific man-made symbols are often used: an X and circle, both small and black. These are used to denote special man-made features of limited size, such as park benches, play equipment and car-wrecks.
